PRESIDENT All Hassan Mwinyi yesterday named his Cabinet in which he retained most of retired Neerer's ministers, creating a new post of Deputy Prime Minister and two new posts.

The second President, who took the oath of office on Tuesday, appointed former Prime Minister Salim Ahmed Salim Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Defence. The other, Ndugu Getrude Mongella, who was Minister of State in the Prime Minister's Office, will head the Ministry of Natural Resources and Tourism. The ministres of Finance and Planning have been merged under Finance Minister Cleopa Msuya. Former Planning Minis-
