### **Thursday, October 22, 1987:      Third CCM Congress begins**

0930 hours      Airport Dodoma – to receive President Kaunda arriving for the Party Congress

1000 hours      Third ordinary Party Congress opens in Kizota, Dodoma

- An address by Party Chairman, Mwalimu Julius K. Nyerere
- An address by the President of UNIP and President of the Republic of Zambia, H.E. Kenneth David Kaunda, current chairman of the FLs & current chairman of the OAU.

1400 hours      Lunch hosted by President at Ikulu in honour of President Kaunda among those present were Mwalimu; Party Secretary General Mzee Kawawa, PM+VP1 Joseph Warioba; President Idris Abdul Wakili and myself.

- After lunch President Kaunda left Dodoma for Lusaka andd was seen off at the airport by President Mwinyi, the PM+VP1 and other Party and Government officials.

1530 – 1740 hours      Congress continued with the hearing of messages from the Heads of the following delegations:

1003 – 1235 hours Hotuba ya Rais Ali Hassan Mwinyi akiwakilisha Taarifa ya Serikali juu ya utekelezaji wa maagizo ya Mkutano Mkuu wa Pili wa Oktoba, 1982, kwa kipindi cha miaka mitano (5) iliyopita (1982 – 1987).

1430 – 1735 hours Statement by the Party Secretary General Mzee Rashidi Mfaume Kawawa Akiwakilisha Taarifa ya Halmashauri Kuu ya Taifa kwa kipindi cha Novemba, 1982 hadi Juni 1987. This was followed by contribution by Congress Participants.

1800 – 1845 hours NEC Secretariat to consider Sitrep.

2100 – 0040 hours Culture performance at Kilimani Club in honour of the Foreign Delegations, I was the Guest of Honour, Performances were made by (i) Kikundi cha Taifa cha Tarab, Zanzibar (ii) Kikundi cha Sanaa, Bagamoyo (iii) JWTZ Cultural Group (iv) VARDA Arts (v) JKT, Mgulani na (vi) Vijana Jazz Band. Before the dance I made a few extempore remarks welcoming the delegations.

### **Saturday, October 24, 1987: Third Day of the Congress**

0830 hours Signing of the Protocol of cooperation between the CCM and the Sandinista National Liberation Front.

I signed on behalf of the CCM while the Deputy Chief of the International Relations of the Sandinista National Liberation Front, Jose Pasos Mereiack. The signing ceremony took place at Kizota.

0900 – 1000 hours Congress hears statements from the Heads of following foreign delegations:

1. MPR of Zaire
2. MNRD of Rwanda
3. Peoples National Congress of Guyana
4. SWAPO of Namibia
5. Socialist Unity Party (SED) of GDR

1000 – 1135 hours Presentation of the Party Program for 1987 to 2002. The program prepared by NEC was presented by Kingunge Ngombale Mwiru, NEC's Secretary for Ideology, Training and Political Education.

1200 hours President Chissano arrived in Dodoma and was met by President Mwinyi and myself and Regional Party and Government Leaders.

- 1300 – 1400 hours Luncheon hosted by President Mwinyi at Ikulu on honour of President Chissano. Among those attending the luncheon were Mwalimu, Party Secretary General, Mzee Kawawa, PM+VP1, Warioba, President Idris Abdul Wakil and myself.
- 1435 – 1800 hours Congress continues. President of FRELIMO and President of Mozambique, Joaquim Alberto Chissano address the Congress.
- Delegates make their contributions referring to the statements by the Chairman, the President, the Party Secretary General and the Party Programme.

**N.B:** President Chissano left Dodoma around 1730 for Dar es Salaam and was seen off by President Mwinyi and Prime Minister Warioba.

### **Sunday, October 25, 1987: Fourth Day of the Congress**

- 0840 hours Signing of the Agreement of Cooperation between the CCM and the Socialist Party of Yemen.
- I signed on behalf of the CCM while Mohamed Saeed Abdul Mahsen, Member of the Politburo and Secretary of the Central Committee for Foreign Affairs of Yemen Arab Socialist Party signed on behalf of his Party.
- 0935 hours The Chairman of the PLO, Yasser Arafat arrived in Dodoma and was met at the airport by President Mwinyi, myself and Regional Party and Government Leaders.
- 1005 – 1100 hours Congress continues and hears an address by Chairman Yasser Arafat of the Palestine Liberation Organisation.
- 1100 – 1225 hours Congress hears statements from the Heads of the following foreign delegations:
1. Communist Party of Czechoslovakia
  2. UPRONA of Burundi
  3. FLN of Angola
  4. Pan Africanist Congress of Azania (South Africa)
  5. Party of Labour of Congo
- 1245 – 1310 hours Meeting at Kizota with the Head of the Korean Workers part delegation to the Congress, Politburo Member and Deputy Premier and Minister for Foreign Affairs, Kim Yong Nam. Also present was the Zanzibar Chief Minister, Seif Sharif Hamad.
- 1315 – 1400 hours Lunch at Ikulu, Hosted by President Mwinyi for Chairman of the PLO, Yasser Arafat. Those present included Mwalimu, Party Secretary General, Mzee Kawawa; President Idris Abdul Wakil, myself, Ambassador Foum and others. After the lunch Chairman Arafat left Dodoma en route to Mogadishu and was seen off by president Mwinyi and Prime Minister, Warioba.

1435 hours Congress continues

- Katibu wa NEC wa Uchumi na Mipango, Seif Sharif Hamad delivers his statement (1435 – 1520) presenting the Social and Economic goals – Maelekezo ya Chama kuhusu Maendeleo ya Uchumi na Jamii katika kipindi cha 1987 – 1992. After this presentation, several delegates to the Congress made their contribution.
- The Party Secretary General made a short summing-up ending the three days debate.

1745 – 1850 hours NEC Secretariat to review sitrep etc.

1910 – 1930 hours Kuonana na ujumbe wa Cuba “nyumbani kwao” hapo Area D.

2115 – 2345 hours Tarab by Kikundi cha Taifa JKT Makutopora. I was the guest of honor.

2358 – 0145 hours Drinks at my Guest House, Makutopora with Major General Walden and Mrs Walden., Deputy Minister of Defence and National Service, Abdul Kinana; Chairman of Arusha, Issa Ramadhani, Mayor of Arusha, Captain Rukiya Masasi and Regional Commissioner for Mara Lt. Col. Nsa Kaisi.

### <sup>1987</sup> Monday, October 26, ~~2007~~: Fifth day of Congress

0900 hours Congress hears statements from the Heads of following Foreign delegations:

1. Party of Labour of Albania
  2. Malawi Congress party
  3. Peoples Revolutionary Party of Mongolia
  4. Polish United Workers Party.
- These were the last foreign delegations to address the Congress. After these presentations, Congress heard statements from
    1. Mabalozi wa Tanzania waliopo Nje iliyosomwa na Balozi Diria
    2. Waasisi wa ASP/TANU ilisomwa na Mzee Milinga
  - Thereafter the Secretary of NEC for organisation Moses Nnauye presented Marekebisho ya Katiba. After a debate, those were approved.

1600 hours Congress Resumed, I presented Four Resolutions as follows:

- (i) Resolution commending the addresses by Party Chairman, the President and the Party Secretary General.
- (ii) Resolution adopting the Party Programme as well as the Social Economic Guidelines for 1987 – 1992;
- (iii) Resolution stressing the importance of expediting movement to the Party and Nation's Capital - Dododma

### (iv) Resolution on Foreign Affairs

- All these resolutions were adopted unanimously. Thereafter Session adjourned to tomorrow.

### **Tuesday, October 27, 1987: Sixth day of the Congress**

Today the Third Ordinary Party Congress entered the phase of Elections for the Membership of the National Executive Committee.

Uchaguzi leo ulikuwa kuwachagua wajumbe wa NEC wa orodha ya Mikoa – Wajumbe 20 wa Mikoa ya Tanzania bara (mmoja kutoka kila Mkoa) na 20 kutoka Tanzania Zanzibar (wane kutoka kila Mkoa).

Ili kutekeleza kazi hiyo Congress walikutana tokea 0900 hadi 1400 hours na baadae kutoka 1530 hadi 2030 hours.

Kwa Mikoa ya Tanzania bara, ukiwacha Mkoa wa Pwani ambako Mgombea alikuwa mmoja tu (Paul Sozigwa – Kalkali), Mikoa yote mingine kulikuwa na Wagombea wawili hadi wane. Na kwa upande wa Mikoa ya Tanzania Visiwani kila Mkoa ulikuwa na wagombea wasiopungua 9 (wajumbe wane ndio wanaotakiwa kuchaguliwa). Mkoa wa Kusini Pemba ulikuwa na wagombea 15.

Kwa Mikoa ya Tanzania bara mgombea ili achaguliwe ilibidi apate Simple majority ya Votes. Lakini kwa Tanzania Zanzibar kwa vile kila Mkoa walitakiwa wajumbe wane, matokeo yalikuwa kwa kutegemea Plurality ya Votes.

Ingawa matokeo ya uchaguzi hayatatangazwa hadi siku ya mwisho ya Mkutano, ilibidi tupige kwa tena kwa wagombea wawili wawili waliopata highest votes wa Mikoa ya Lindi, Dodoma, Singida na Morogoro kwa vile hakuna aliopata required simple majority.

Utaratibu uliotumika ni kwa kila mgombea kuja mbele na kutoa maelezo kama kuna masuala kuulizwa. It became evident that the Congress delegates had no time for any questions. Only one or two irrelevant questions were asked but delegates in unison seemed to consider them irrelevant.

### **Wednesday, October 28, 1987: Seventh Day of Congress**

Congress leo pia iliendelea na uchaguzi wa wajumbe wa Halamashauri Kuu ya Taifa. Leo ilikuwa ni wakati wa uchaguzi wa wajumbe kutoka orodha ya Viti Tisini – orodha ya Taifa.

Kutoka 0900 hours had 1145 hours ulifanywa uchaguzi wa kundi la wanawake (upendeleo maalumu). Kulikuwa na wagombea 60 kwa nafasi 10 tu.

From 1400 – 1900 hours Uchaguzi uliendela kwa mapangilio ufuatao:

- Kundi la Vijana – palikuwepo na wagombea 34 wakigombea nafasi 5
- Kundi la Wanajeshi – wagombea 22 kwa nafasi 5

- Kundi la Tanzania Zanzibar – Kulikuwa na wagombea 64 kwa nafasi 20. Lakini wagombea kutoka Zanzibar walikuwa hawakuchaguliwa katika makundi ya wanawake, Vijana na Wanajeshi wote waliongezwa juu ya hiyo orodha ya mwanzo ya wagombea 64. kwa hiyo orodha ya wagombea wa Tanzania Zanzibar iliongezeka na kuwa na idadi ya wagombea ....

### **Thursday, October 29, 1987: Eighth Day of the Congress**

Congress imeendelea na uchaguzi wa Wajumbe wa Halmashauri Kuu ya Taifa – orodha ya Taifa – Viti 90. leo ilikuwa ni zamu ya wagombea katika Kundi la Tanzania Bara. Kulikuwa na original list ya wagombea 123 kwa nafasi 20. Pamoja na hao 123, “Kapu” lilongezewa wagombea wote wale kutoka Tanzania Bara ambao hawakufaulu kutoka orodha ya Wanawake, Vijana na Majeshi. Kwa hiyo jumla ya wagombea kwa nafasi hizo 20 ilikuwa ni.....

Kikao ambacho kilianza mnamo saa 0900 kiliahirishwa mnamo 1400 hours baada ya kumalizika upigaji kura wa nafasi hizo 20.

### **Friday, October 30, 1987: Ninth Day of the Congress**

Congress leo ilimaliza shughuli za uchaguzi. Asubuhi Mkutano ulimaliza orodha ya Taifa – Viti Tisini/

Leo ilikuwa ni siku ya “Kapu”. Yaani wagombea wote walioshindwa kufaulu katika (a) Kundi la Tanzania Zanzibar (b) Kundi la Tanzania Bara- wakiwemo wote wale ambao walisali kutokana Makundi ya Wanawake, Vijana na Wanajeshi.

Idadi ya wagombea ilikuwa zaidi ya 240 na nafasi ziliopo ni 30 tu. Kwa hiyo hii ilikuwa ni sokomoko ya hali yake – ya aina yake! Ndio maana lakitwa “Kapu”. Lakini kwa jinsi idadi ilivyokuwa kubwa mwaka huu basi wengine wamekiita Gunia (Major General Marwa); wengine wamekiita Tenga na jina ambalo hatimaye lilipata most popular acceptance ni “Comtainer”. Ingawa matokeo ya uchaguzi wa Vikundi mbali mbali hayatangazwi; by the process of elimination by the time of Kapu, those who had made it were known. Also known were those who were joining the Kapu. And it is became evident that viongozi wengi wazito wameingia katika container.

By about noon the voting on the Kapu was over. Congress had a luch recess.

When it resumed in the afternoon the Congress proceeded to a vote on first the Party Chairman and secondly the Party Vice Chairman. For the Party Chairman position, Rais Mwinyi on behalf of NEC submitted the nomination of Mwalimu Nyerere; after Mwalimu's acceptance speech, the Secretary General on behalf of NEC proposed Rais Mwinyi's name for the post of the Chairmanship thereafter the delegates preceeded to a vote.

### **Saturday, October 31, 1987: Tenth and Final Day of the Third Ordinary CCM Congress**

1310 – 1340 hours    Lunch at Kizota for all the Members of the Secretariat Kizota. This was the last lunch together as the Secretariat as presently constituted. It is also the last time for the lunch at Kizota VIP premises.

1410 – 1700 hours    Concluding Session and closing ceremony of the Third Ordinary Session of the CCM Congress.

The Party elections generally went well and reflected the maturity of our people. Votes did indeed exercise their independent mind despite in some cases mudslinging campaigns. Reports of involvement of some senior Party figures in the campaign against Seif are disturbing. All indications are that their campaign was effectively coordinated and Seif suffered the consequences. His failure to get elected to the Central Committee is a ~~-----~~ to the 'success' of that campaign. This is one unhealthy aspect of the Congress. The decision of the Zanzibaris became more clearly pronounced on this as well as in aspect of few other candidates. There is an urgent need to great the words of this decision; otherwise the situation in the Islands is based to get worse. *wounds*

The non-election of Cleopa Msuya also was a surprise and unexpected development. Personally I was saddened by both the failing of Seif and Msuya to be elected. I voted consistently for both as I voted for all the other members of the outgoing Central Committee.
